She graduated from the Boston University School of Medicine in 2002, and remained at the Boston University Medical Center for her orthopaedic residency training. In 2008, Dr. Lochner completed a hand, upper extremity and microvascular surgery fellowship at Duke University Medical Center. She has recently received additional fellowship training in pediatric hand and upper extremity surgery at the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas, Texas.

Dr. Lochner is a member of several professional societies including the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, the American Society for Surgery of the Hand, and the Piedmont Orthopaedic Society.
