He provided physician support and team coverage for 27 Division I athletic teams including basketball, football, baseball, soccer, track & field, tennis, rugby, lacrosse, volleyball, gymnastics, rowing, water polo, and softball.

Dr. Dixit is board certified in both Internal Medicine and Sports Medicine by the American Board of Internal Medicine.
